ST GILES ANNUAL MEETING

(This may be subject to change again, following the government's new restrictions)

The postponed Annual Vestry and Annual Parochial Church Meetings due to be held on 29th March 2020 has **now been rearranged for Sunday, 4th OCTOBER** and will take place after the morning service.

At the APCM meeting, in order to prevent people remaining too long in church after the service, we will only deal with what is legally necessary. The Annual Report and Agenda, which had been prepared for the March meeting, will be available on our website, and also via email ahead of the October meeting. Paper copies will be available for the meeting on the day, along with any other papers. If you have any questions concerning the contents of the report which covers the churches life from APCM 2019 - March 2020, then please email them or ring in by 28th September. Written response will be made and then circulated.

At these meetings, churchwardens are elected for the coming year, together with members of the Parochial Church Councils and representatives to the Deanery Synod. **Nomination forms for all of these roles will in due course be available in church, or by email from Vivienne Smales, our administrator—**

St Giles needs to elect: 4 churchwardens (1 year term), 3 PCC members for 3 years and one casual vacancy for 1 year, also 4 Deanery Synod representatives (3 year term).

Nomination forms should be sent to the parish office or handed to Canon June by Sunday 29th September.

Please prayerfully consider if God is calling you to these roles, and speak to Canon June if you have any questions.

SERVICES PATTERN

Just a note to say that we are keeping under review our present service pattern. It will be obvious to you all that as restrictions continue to apply we can't fit our usual (pre-Covid) congregational numbers in. At present, however, we can and we still have some capacity, but this could change when people not currently attending Sunday worship return. When we need to alter times, the pattern would be a 9.30am Mass (live-streamed as needed) followed by a 11.00am choral Mass (not live-streamed). The first Mass we envisage being shorter, and music, if able to be incorporated in some form, would be more limited than the 11.00am. We would need to keep sufficient space between services to sanitise the seats used.

It would help us if you are still staying at home on Sundays to let us know when you think you might return to Sunday services, as this will help us to see when we may need to change our pattern—stgileschurchpontefract@gmail.com

The monthly **8.00am Mass** will not be able to resume on 6th September and will be catered for by the 9.30am service if this is in place by October.

It is not envisaged that **The Friday Mass** can return until the beginning of October.

St Mary's Church will not be able to begin Sunday services from 6th September as originally hoped. The timing of when the Sunday Mass might begin again will be reviewed later in September, hopefully in time for October.

Church will only be open 20 minutes prior to the service time.

WELCOME TO WORSHIP



It is wonderful to be back together in our much-loved building to share together in worship and prayer. BUT...

We need to keep ourselves and each other safe as we gather together in this building in which prayer has been offered for many centuries. Please read the guidance below and follow any signs, notices and instructions given by the clergy, wardens and other stewards and helpers.

FACE MASKS - it is now mandatory (a legal requirement) to wear a face mask in church. Exemptions include - young children under the age of 11, people advised medically not to do so, people with a disability that makes the handling of masks difficult, those for whom it would cause mental distress.

Those who are leading services (generally clergy) or events in a place of worship, and those who assist them (for instance by reading, preaching, or leading prayer) do not always need to wear a face covering, although one should be worn especially if physical distancing cannot be maintained (i.e. distributing consumables).

TEST AND TRACE - A warden will tick off your name on the electoral roll if you are present for Sunday or Wednesday services. New people will be asked to fill in a simple form. This is so that we can support the Government's Test and Trace program. These records are for all our safety and will be destroyed after 21 days and will not be used for any other purpose.

HAND HYGIENE - You will be asked to cleanse your hands on entry and exit from the building. Please try not to touch anything that you do not need to touch including other people who are not part of your 'household bubble'.

SOCIAL DISTANCING - Please follow the current social distancing guidance. Please go straight to your seat as guided by the stewards and remain there until the end of the service, other than when you go forward to receive during Communion.

SEATING ARRANGEMENTS - Social distancing dictates that individuals will need to be allocated seats that will maintain the current requirements, but family and / or Household units may sit together on one line of seats if they wish to do so. Please do not move any chairs from where they have been placed!

SERVICE SHEETS – These will be fresh for each service. They may be taken home, or placed in the recycle box as you leave the building.

MUSIC, SINGING AND RESPONSES - Singing is not currently permitted for congregations. However, we are able to have a small group of choir members to sing hymns/choral music in the service. All responses will be said using a **quiet** voice.

SOCIAL INTERACTION AND THE PEACE - Social interaction needs to happen whilst maintaining social distancing, so please only share the Peace by means of a smile and a suitable gesture rather than the traditional handshake or hug!

RECEIVING COMMUNION - When it is time to receive HOLY COMMUNION, please allow the sides-people to direct you when to move. Sanitise your hands as directed. When you reach the priest, please stretch out your hands and the bread will be placed into them. The priest will wear a face-covering.

AT THE END OF THE SERVICE - Please remain in your seat until a steward asks you to leave, and then please go directly to the designated exit as guided by them. Please do any 'catching up' outside the building and mindful of social distancing.

FOOD AND DRINK - There will be no refreshments available after the service.

LIGHTING OF CANDLES - this will not be possible before or during the Service, but once the area is empty after the service has ended, stewards will assist a safe flow of people.

TOILETS - Toilet facilities are available, but only one person will be able to enter the toilet area at a time to ensure social distancing.

TITHES AND OFFERINGS - Cash offerings whether loose cash or in envelopes should be placed by you onto the plate near the exit door. There will be no offertory during the service. We would urge you to speak with the treasurer about changing your giving to direct debit, via your banking account, if that is possible for you.



PONTEFRACT FOODBANK—HARVEST FOOD COLLECTION

As part of the Harvest food collection this year, St Giles will be collecting donations of basic long-life foods for the Foodbank. Please bring donations to church and place them in the trolley by the door on the Sunday before (27th) or the Sunday when harvest is celebrated. Your time is just as valuable. Pontefract Foodbank has had a difficult year. In March, the Foodbank trustees took the incredibly hard decision to suspend food distribution from Central Methodist Church premises. The first consideration had to be safety and, with the 2m social distancing rule in place at that time, it was decided that it was not possible to provide a safe environment for our volunteers in the (very small) food warehouse.

Sadly, although during July and August, the lockdown restrictions eased a little, we had to face the unexpected death of our treasurer and trustee, Neville Hughes. We also said goodbye to our chair, Anne Webb and our warehouse manager, Peter Snell. It has been a really sad and difficult time for us.

However, with support from the Trussell Trust, we have worked out a “come-back plan” and are now delighted to announce that the Foodbank will restart food distribution from the 17th September using a delivery system and e- (emailed) vouchers.

Our new method of service delivery means that requests for help with emergency food from the week beginning 14th September can be made to the main Council switchboard Tel 0345 8 506 506. Council colleagues will talk things through with the person needing help and, if possible, send on the request for help by secure email to the Foodbank. Foodbank volunteer driving teams will take food to client’s homes.

We are fortunate that, as more and more families face financial hardship as furlough ends, we will be able to share the task of providing emergency food parcels for the time being with St Mary’s Hub. Thank you St Mary’s - your ongoing contribution will enable the Foodbank to get up and running in top gear during the Autumn.

During the Autumn, like all charities depending on donations and operating in the uncertainty brought by Covid-19, the Foodbank is likely to face issues in maintaining the help it offers to local people. Perhaps the only certainties are that the need for the Foodbank is likely to rise as the end of furlough for some may mean redundancy and a 5 week wait before Universal Credit can be obtained or the uncertainty of zero hours contracts providing fluctuating income. So at this time the Foodbank would be particularly grateful for your support.

With our thanks for your past support and hoping that you can help in whatever way you are able as long as Pontefract needs a Foodbank.
