**** NO PUBLIC WORSHIP IN CHURCH UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE ****

The standing committee of the PCC has reviewed the present suspension of public worship and decided that the time is not yet right to reopen. A further review will take place after the government has set out its 'road map' on 22nd February. The Bishop and Archdeacon have been informed and an extension to the 17th February date granted.

Public services will be live-streamed on Facebook on Sunday, 21st February at 10.15am, Wednesday, 24th February at 9.30am and Sunday, 28th February at 10.15am.

Morning Prayer on Tuesdays at 9.00am during Lent, will be live-streamed beginning on Tuesday, 23rd February.

Compline moves to 6.00pm on Sundays (from 21st) during Lent.
No Compline, therefore, on Thursday, 18th February.

¹⁸ For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. Canon June writes...

'For God loves a cheerful giver..'

Last week, we received a letter from Bishop Nick and the diocesan secretary Jonathan Wood, thanking churches for all that they had done to contribute to the Parish Share, in a very challenging financial landscape for churches, due to successive lockdowns. Bishop Nick reminded us that 'our contribution goes to support mission and ministry in every corner of the Diocese of Leeds.'



In times past, the Parish Share was known as 'the common fund.' Whatever its name, the words 'share' and 'common' highlight to us that when we fulfil a responsibility to pay it as fully as we are able, we help other Christian communities to flourish across our diocese. There is very explicit gospel teaching to 'give generously' as part of our Christian discipleship and also New Testament teaching for churches to generously support each other. This principle undergirds the diocesan 'parish share.'

St Giles with St Mary's paid the parishes share in full (£54,972 inc £4398 from

St Mary's) but only because we had the financial reserves to do so. For a number of years, the PCC has needed to set a deficit budget and make up the shortfall from reserves. This financial year was no different, so before covid 19, it was expected that we would be drawing down £10,000 to cover all our costs. If we then add to this our losses in 2020, as detailed below, you will see the situation.

David Leigh our treasurer, writes

'On top of a projected budget deficit of £10k, the PCC account suffered a reduction in income of ~£27k as a result of the pandemic. This loss was largely offset by transfers from a Legacy (£30k) and £6k from the Centre account (a 'Discretionary' Grant of £5k from WMDC and a donation of £1k towards the Parish Share).

The PCC has needed to set its budget for 2021 and again expects that income will be reduced, at least for the first 6 months of the year. So, 2021 will present further financial challenges for us.

So firstly, it is very important to say a massive 'thank you' to all of you for continuing to

give of your financial resources and taking care to ensure that the treasurer receives your donation even when you are not able to come into church and donate on the plate. Our ministry and mission in Pontefract depend on that generosity. Additionally, parishes beyond our own are 'supported' when we are able to pay the full parish share request. We certainly don't want the CofE to only provide ministry in wealthy parishes because 'they can afford to pay parish share'.

Secondly, I also want to thank individuals who have made 'one off gifts' to help us with additional costs related to livestreaming and improving the sound quality (new radio mikes) when we return to public worship. Other donations

helped us to buy seasonal prayer and reflection material and provide Easter and Christmas cards. A bequest bought us some new chasubles and altar linen, paschal candle studs and an oil set for anointing the sick and dying. Every donation, above and beyond usual giving, however small, makes something possible that might otherwise not happen. Smaller amounts added together help to make a difference.

Thirdly, if you haven't been able to send in your usual donations whilst the church has been closed, then might you be able to post a cheque to our treasurer including the envelopes you normally use? Or might it be possible to consider switching to giving to St Giles by standing order via your bank? The church bank details are below if you would like to set up a regular payment, David Leigh will also advise if you are unsure how to do this.

One of the disciplines of Lent is reviewing our almsgiving: could I ask each of us in coming weeks to prayerfully reflect on our existing giving and decide whether we feel that we can increase the monthly amount we give, (of course we may need to reduce giving because of loss of income). If together we can help to address the £10,000 shortfall each year (or £833.33 per month) and the additional loss of income that covid 19 will still present us with in at least the first half of this year, then our churches and other churches will benefit from that generosity through the parish share. St Paul writing to the Corinthian church reminds them of the importance of 'giving' to enable ministry within and beyond themselves: 'each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.' (from 2 Corinthians 9:7- the whole chapter is worth a read).

With grateful thanks for all that you generously give to enable ministry and mission at St Giles and St Mary's and, through the full payment of our parish share, to additionally enabling ministry and mission beyond ourselves.





Rhythm of Life—Lent Courses

There are two diocesan-wide Rhythm of Life courses running separately during the season of Lent. They will be running on:

- Thursday Mornings between 10.30am - 12.00 noon (Thursday 25th February - Thursday 1st April)

Both online courses consist of 6 weekly sessions throughout Lent. The course is running twice to accommodate people's availability and day/time preference. The course can serve as a stepping-stone for participant's further engagement with the Rhythm of Life venture. The sessions will provide an opportunity to engage with the seven Rhythm of Life areas for deepening commitment to: praying, reflecting, encouraging, sharing, resting, celebrating, and creating.

Pray – light a candle, if safe, and pray for hope, faith and strength to keep loving and caring for each other during this time of struggle.



Talk about how you feel. This may be difficult if you are self-isolating, but use the phone, internet and social media. If you need to contact a counsellor, this can be arranged by your GP, local agencies or privately. Samaritans are there 24 hours a day, every day, and it's free to call them on 116 123.



Focus on the things that you can change, not on the things you can't.



Look after yourself – physically, emotionally, spiritually. Plan things that you enjoy at regular intervals during the day – a TV programme, a phone call, a book, a favourite dish, a game.



Look after others – even if only in small ways, but do what you can: a smile, a kind word, writing a letter or an email.
