WELCOME TO WORSHIP- helping to keep each other safe.

- FACE MASKS – must be worn unless you are exempt
- TEST AND TRACE – Please give your details to the sidesperson or use the NHS ‘Test and Trace’ app

- RECEIVING COMMUNION – The sidespeople will direct you. Please sanitise your hands as directed. When you reach the priest, please remove your mask and stretch out your hands.
- AT THE END OF THE SERVICE - Please remain in your seat until a steward asks you to leave, and then please go directly to the designated exit as guided by them.
- FOOD AND DRINK – sadly, there can be no refreshments available after the service.
- LIGHTING OF CANDLES – can be done after the service.
- TOILETS -Toilet facilities are available, but only one person will be able to enter the toilet area at a time to ensure social distancing.
- TITHES AND OFFERINGS – please place onto the plate near the exit door.

Once in the building, in the light of the continued covid restrictions, could we respectfully ask you not to pursue conversation with others seated near you but not part of your family/bubble. Our permissions to meet physically for public worship do not extend to socialising together indoors. The rule of six applies to outdoors, however we must not give any impression of lots of groups of six gathering together outdoors around the building. Please move away to avoid this happening.

## The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading                      Acts 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. 'This,' he said, 'is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.'

So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when

you will restore the kingdom to Israel?’ He replied, ‘It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.’ When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, ‘Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.’

This is the word of the Lord.

and his kingdom will have no end.**


**We believe in the Holy Spirit,


# Taking of the Bread and Wine

we remember his offering of himself  
made once for all upon the cross;

we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension;  
we look for the coming of your kingdom,  
and with this bread and this cup  
we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.
