## LIVE STREAMING OF SERVICES

The time has come to cease live-streaming of our services. It has been massively important to us during the covid restrictions but none the less very restrictive of how we can conduct worship in church once restrictions have begun to ease. This has become increasingly evident as more and more people have returned Sunday by Sunday. We now do need to resume more normality in how we use our worship space. Continued live-streaming of worship done well and more professionally would need further financial investment and also personnel to work any equipment. The time investment can be considerable for those involved.

Compline will continue to be live-streamed and we will look for other ways in which live-streaming might be appropriate on specific occasions.

## **OPENING AND MANAGING OF CHURCH BUILDINGS IN STEP 4 OF THE ROADMAP OUT OF LOCKDOWN**

Church of England guidance | September 2021 notes that ‘the Government has moved from overarching rules to stop the spread of the virus to guidance that emphasises the personal and corporate responsibility of individuals and organisations undertake actions to protect others and themselves’.

### **Please note:**

- We advise that those able to wear masks continue to wear them for services, including singing, and when moving around church.
- Small groups to make a decision on the necessity of masks or otherwise.
- When seated in the café, masks are not required, but advised when entering or leaving.
- Hand sanitizer stations will continue to be available and their use encouraged.
- Doors will continue to be left open to improve ventilation.
- If you would like seat spaces left between you and the next person, please take cards from reception to place on the seats beside you.
- The gaps between rows will be reduced. Strict socially distanced seating will be retained in the balcony.
- We will not, at this point, be making any changes to how we currently share the peace.
- The priest will continue to hand sanitise and wear a face covering when distributing communion.
- We will continue following a one-way system for communion and moving around church.
- We will retain only taking communion in one kind until we can return to the common cup safely.
- The collection will remain as a basket placed near the north door.
- As yet we are not able to return to serving refreshments after Sunday services, though Wednesday and Saturday refreshments resumed in the café from 1<sup>st</sup> September.
- Though not now mandatory, we will continue to provide additional cleaning of the church during this period.

It is no longer a legal requirement to wear a face covering, though the government expects and recommends that people wear face coverings in crowded and enclosed settings to protect themselves and others.
